1. Complete online registration form. You will receive a confirmation email with instructions for sending in the deposit.

US Mail:

1. Complete the registration and volunteer forms.
2. Attach a check or money order in US\$ payable to WCBS for at least \$85 (\$50 deposit plus \$35 non-refundable registration fee).
3. A medical release / Responsible adult form is required for all individuals under 18 years old that are attending without a parent. Forms are available from the registrar or can be downloaded from **<http://MenuchaBibleSchool.org>**
4. Mail completed forms to the Registrar. (See contact info.)
5. Send final payment prior to July 1st. Payments received after July 1st are subject to a late fee of \$20 per person.

- Limited family rooms available at dormitory rates.
- Deluxe rooms include: 1 queen bed + 2 twin beds, private bath.
- Linen and bedding included in semi-private and deluxe rooms.
- Extra charge for linen and bedding in dormitory rooms: \$10 per set. Otherwise bring bed linen, pillow and towels.

Other Rates:

- Children's class teachers, children's Friday evening program director and Choir director: \$100 credit each
- Meal Servers: \$50 credit. Teens and young adults, must be at least 12 years old.
- RV or Camping: Same as dormitory rates
- Visitors and Commuters: You must register and pay in advance. You may attend classes and other events. However, Menucha charges a facility fee of \$15 per day plus meals. Meal availability is dependant on the number of full time attendees and will not be know until mid July.
