The Sermon on the Mount

(The Kingdom of God)

Matthew 4:23-25

<u>23</u> ¶And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people.

<u>24</u> And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them. <u>25</u> And there followed him great multitudes of people from Galilee, and *from* Decapolis, and *from* Jerusalem, and *from* Judaea, and *from* beyond Jordan.

Matthew 5:1-3, 5, 10

<u>1</u> And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him:
<u>2</u> And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying,
<u>3</u> Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
<u>5</u> Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.
<u>10</u> Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 6:33

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

Matthew 5:17

¶Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil.

Exodus 19:3-6

<u>3</u> And Moses went up unto God, and the LORD called unto him out of the mountain, saying, Thus shalt thou say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel;

<u>4</u> Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself.

5 Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth *is* mine:

<u>6</u> And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel.

Isaiah 5:1-4

<u>1</u> Now will I sing to my wellbeloved a song of my beloved touching his vineyard. My wellbeloved hath a vineyard in a very fruitful hill: <u>2</u> And he fenced it, and gathered out the stones thereof, and planted it with the choicest vine, and built a tower in the midst of it, and also made a winepress therein: and he looked that it should bring forth grapes, and it brought forth wild grapes.

<u>3</u> And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem, and men of Judah, judge, I pray you, betwixt me and my vineyard.

<u>4</u> What could have been done more to my vineyard, that I have not done in it? wherefore, when I looked that it should bring forth grapes, brought it forth wild grapes?

<u>7</u> For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts *is* the house of Israel, and the men of Judah his pleasant plant: and he looked for judgment, but behold oppression; for righteousness, but behold a cry.

Genesis 18:17-19

<u>17</u> And the LORD said, Shall I hide from Abraham that thing which I do;

<u>18</u> Seeing that Abraham shall surely become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him?

<u>19</u> For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.

Psalms 103:6-8

<u>6</u> The LORD executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed.

<u>7</u> He made known his ways unto Moses, his acts unto the children of Israel.

<u>8</u> The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy.

Exodus 34:4-8

<u>4</u> ¶And he hewed two tables of stone like unto the first; and Moses rose up early in the morning, and went up unto mount Sinai, as the LORD had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tables of stone.

5 And the LORD descended in the cloud, and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name of the LORD.

<u>6</u> And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth,

<u>7 Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression</u> and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth generation.

8 And Moses made haste, and bowed his head toward the earth, and worshipped.

Jeremiah 9:23-24

<u>23</u> ¶Thus saith the LORD, Let not the wise *man* glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty *man* glory in his might, let not the rich *man* glory in his riches:

<u>24</u> But let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the LORD which exercise lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth: for in these things I delight, saith the LORD.

Hosea 2:19, 20

<u>19</u> And I will betroth thee unto me for ever; yea, I will betroth thee unto me in righteousness, and in judgment, and in lovingkindness, and in mercies.

<u>20</u> I will even betroth thee unto me in faithfulness: and thou shalt know the LORD.

Leviticus 19:15

¶Ye shall do no unrighteousness in judgment: thou shalt not respect the person of the poor, nor honour the person of the mighty: but in righteousness shalt thou judge thy neighbour.

Leviticus 19:1, 2

And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <u>2</u> Speak unto all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say unto them, <u>Ye shall</u> be holy: for I the LORD your God *am* holy.

Leviticus 19:9-14

<u>9</u> ¶And when ye reap the harvest of your land, thou shalt not wholly reap the corners of thy field, neither shalt thou gather the gleanings of thy harvest.

<u>10</u> And thou shalt not glean thy vineyard, neither shalt thou gather every grape of thy vineyard; thou shalt leave them for the poor and stranger: I am the LORD your God.

<u>11</u> ¶Ye shall not steal, neither deal falsely, neither lie one to another.

<u>12</u> ¶And ye shall not swear by my name falsely, neither shalt thou profane the name of thy God: I am the LORD.

<u>13</u> **Thou shalt not defraud thy neighbour, neither rob him**: the wages of him that is hired shall not abide with thee all night until the morning.

<u>14</u> **¶Thou shalt not curse the deaf, nor put a stumblingblock before** the blind, but shalt fear thy God: I *am* the LORD.

Leviticus 25:10

And ye shall hallow the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof: it shall be a jubile unto you; and ye shall return every man unto his possession, and ye shall return every man unto his family.

Deuteronomy 15:1, 2

<u>1</u> At the end of *every* seven years thou shalt make a release. <u>2</u> And this *is* the manner of the release: Every creditor that lendeth *ought* unto his neighbour shall release *it*; he shall not exact *it* of his neighbour, or of his brother; because it is called the LORD'S release.

Leviticus 19:15-18

<u>15</u> ¶Ye shall do no unrighteousness in judgment: thou shalt not respect the person of the poor, nor honour the person of the mighty: *but* in righteousness shalt thou judge thy neighbour.

<u>16</u> ¶Thou shalt not go up and down *as* a talebearer among thy people: neither shalt thou stand against the blood of thy neighbour: I *am* the LORD.

<u>17</u> ¶Thou shalt not hate thy brother in thine heart: thou shalt in any wise rebuke thy neighbour, and not suffer sin upon him.

<u>18</u> ¶Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people, but thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself: I am the LORD.

Deuteronomy 10:18

He doth execute the judgment of the fatherless and widow, and loveth the stranger, in giving him food and raiment.

Isaiah 58: 1, 2

<u>1</u> Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet, and shew my people their transgression, and the house of Jacob their sins.
<u>2</u> Yet they seek me daily, and delight to know my ways, as a nation that did righteousness, and forsook not the ordinance of their God: they ask of me the ordinances of justice; they take delight in approaching to God.

Isaiah 59:13, 14

<u>13</u> In transgressing and lying against the LORD, and departing away from our God, speaking oppression and revolt, conceiving and uttering from the heart words of falsehood. <u>14</u> And justice is turned away backward, and righteousness standeth

afar off: for truth is fallen in the street, and equity cannot enter.

Amos 5:21-24

<u>21</u>¶I hate, I despise your feast days, and I will not smell in your solemn assemblies.

<u>22</u> Though ye offer me burnt offerings and your meat offerings, I will not accept *them*: neither will I regard the peace offerings of your fat beasts.

23 Take thou away from me the noise of thy songs; for I will not hear the melody of thy viols.

24 But let judgment run down as waters, and righteousness as a mighty stream.

Matthew 6:33

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

Psalms 82:1-4

<u>1</u> God standeth in the congregation of the mighty; he judgeth among the gods.

<u>2</u> How long will ye judge unjustly, and accept the persons of the wicked? Selah.

<u>3</u> Defend the poor and fatherless: do justice to the afflicted and needy.

<u>4</u> Deliver the poor and needy: rid *them* out of the hand of the wicked.

<u>6</u> I have said, Ye are gods; and all of you are children of the most High.

John 10:34-36

<u>34</u> Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods?

<u>35</u> If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken;

36 Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God?
