

The Parable of Two Debtors (Matthew 18:23-35)

King and Servant

The King in the parable forgave his servant a debt of 10,000 talents.

1 denarii = 1 day's wages

1 talent = 6,000 denarii



Based on today's minimum wage, this debt would equal \$7.04 billion, and would take 200,000 years of work to pay off.

Two Servants

The same servant was owed 100 denarii by a fellow-servant which was one-day's wage. This amount equaled about four months' salary.

100 denarii equivalent to about \$11,700 for minimum wage worker (\$35,200 annually) in 2018.

Have We Chosen the Wrong Paradigm?


Both Liberalism and Conservatism are Political, Ideological Constructs Arising From French Revolution


Liberalism (progressive, Left, etc.) and Conservatism (regressive, Right, etc.) are NOT biblical terms, but rather were political labels used to distinguish two different viewpoints (Edmund Burke vs. Thomas Paine) of the aisle during debates following the French Revolution.

Use of these terms results in wrong thinking and wrong conclusions. These terms should never have been used to identify Brothers and Sisters of Christ.

We can and ought to be merciful, holy, gracious, just, godly, patient, righteous and kind.

The Bible tempers multiple, competing and sometimes abstract principles for disciples to consider in decision-making rather than a simplistic ideological, artificial construct, i.e., it's right vs. wrong, good vs. evil, rather than "Liberal" and "Conservative, etc."

Our pride is hurt by each other's arrogance. The dreadful predicament is not due to economic conflicts. It is due to a spiritual paralysis. This is an age of suspicion, when most of us seem to live by the rule: Suspect thy neighbor as thyself."

What is Malignity? Why We Should Be Concerned?

"Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity [malicious]; whisperers"

- The word malignity in Romans 1:29 is the Greek word kakoētheia which literally means "evil-naturedness."
- In classical Greek, Aristotle used kakoētheia to describe "the spirit which always supposes the worst about other people" while Pliny called it "malignity of interpretation."
- Church of England cleric Jeremy Taylor (1613-1667) said that malignity is "a baseness of nature by which we take things by the wrong handle, and expound things always in the worst sense."





The faith of Hosea's fathers had become so debased that in almost every respect it was now the opposite of the great original."







Some translators have the phrase "they assemble themselves" (yitgôrārû) in Hosea 7:14 while some think and correct this phrase as "they gash themselves" (yitgôdādû).
